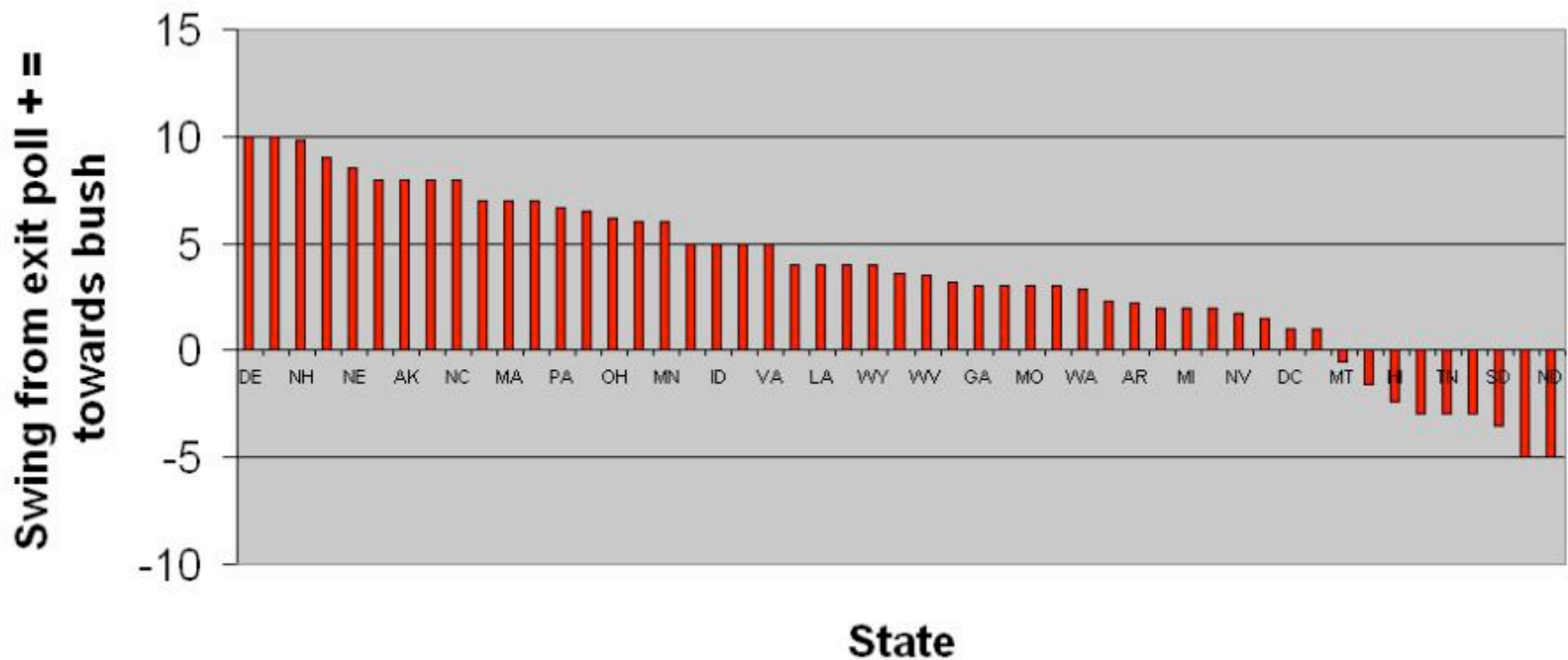


# Exit Polls Showed Kerry Leading

<b>State</b>	<b>Exit Poll Data 11/2</b>	<b>Final Vote Tally</b>	<b>Percentage Shift Toward Bush</b>
<b>1. Iowa</b>	<b>Kerry by 1.3%</b>	<b>Bush by .9%</b>	<b>+2.2%</b>
